CII along with the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship and Ministry of Labour & Employment is partnering with Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) and Association of German Chambers of Industry and Commerce, DIHK to organize the **Expert Seminar on Skill Development titled: India-Germany : Towards a Strategy “Skilling India” on April 15 at Hannover Messe**

India sits at a tremendous demographic advantage. India's current population of 1.2 billion is expected to enlarge to 1.8 billion by 2045, with significant expansion in the size of its working age (15-64 years) population.

However, challenges of a persistent skill gap remain. Only 2% of the population is vocationally trained. The question of reforming the VET system by adapting the German dual system has long been discussed the Indo German Working Group on Vocational Training and Education. Both the Government of India and the Federal Government of Germany have exhibited commitment in the area of vocational training with both governments agreeing to incorporate the action of the Working Group into a 'roadmap' in the future for strategic planning purposes in India.

One of the breakthroughs has been the adaptation of the Apprenticeship scheme from the international partner to enable efficient implementation of the amended Apprenticeship Act in India. The fulcrum of the German dual system is the manner in which the issue of horizontal and vertical progression is handled. The Indian side has made progress and has started adapting a few features of the dual system, such as Training of Trainers

The Expert Seminar will give indepth insight into the many opportunities that exist in skill development in India and areas in which the dual system has gained prominence.
