THE CITY

As a city of trade fairs, events and sport, Hannover is a place of international encounter. Among the annual events that attract visitors in their thousands are the Maschsee Lake Festival and the biggest Marksmen's Funfair in the world.

New Town Hall



The town hall dating from 1913 houses the city's government as well as 3D town models which can be visited in the opulent main hall. The curving lift to the

town hall's dome is unique in Europe. At a 17-degree angle it covers the 43 metres up to the gallery at the top of the dome which offers a marvellous view of the whole city.

MUSEUMS & STAGES



Distinguished and diverse, Hannover's landscape of museums and art galleries enjoys an outstanding reputation. The Sprengel Museum Hannover is among the most important addresses in the world for the art of the 20th and the 21st centuries; the kestnergesellschaft, the Kunstverein (Arts Association) and the Ahlers Pro Arte/Kestner Pro Arte Foundation are further institutions for contemporary art with reputations extending well beyond the region. Visitors to the Lower Saxony State Museum (Landesmuseum) in Hannover will find Departments of Prehistory, Natural History and Ethnology, the State Art Gallery, the coin cabinet of the state of Lower Saxony and an aquarium. The Museum August Kestner presents the ancient world and ancient Egypt, while the history of the state and the city is recounted in the Museum of History. Wilhelm Busch – German Museum for Caricature and Drawings houses caricature, satirical art and an unique Wilhelm Busch Collection.
